

Launched 1st Multi Skill Training Centre



Women face countless extra hurdles in the working world. They earn less than men, are more likely to be unemployed, are over-represented in vulnerable employment situations, and have extra challenges when starting their own businesses.

While unemployment in urban India stood at 8.16 per cent in January, in rural areas it was the lowest at 5.84 per cent, as per data by independent think-tank Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE).

In December, the unemployment rate stood at 7.91 per cent, with urban at 9.30 per cent and rural at 7.28 per cent, it added. India has **53 million** unemployed people as of December 2021 and a huge proportion of them are women, the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy said.

Of these, 35 million are the unemployed who are actively seeking work while

17 million are those who, though willing to work, are not actively seeking it, CMIE said.

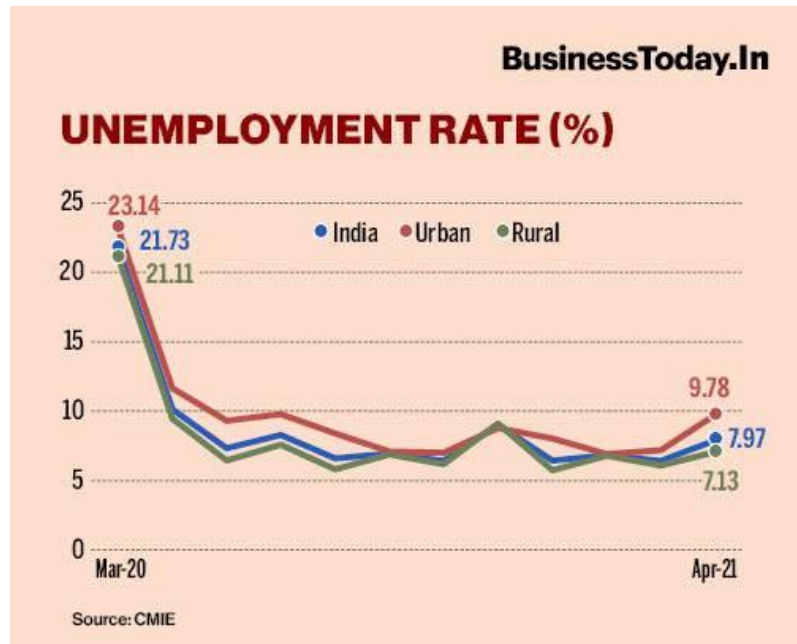
India needs to immediately provide employment to the 7.9% who are in the unemployment rate or 35 million in December 2021 who were not employed and they were actively.

Vocational training has raised women's earnings, rates of overall employment, and rates of formal employment in low- and middle-income countries.
